*Happy New Year! As I reflect on 2007, I wanted to share with you some of the highlights and successes at Briarcliffe College during the last year. They included (and in no particular order):*

*Maurice DuBois, four-time Emmy award-winning co-anchor of CBS 2 News This Morning delivered the commencement address to more than 800 Briarcliffe College graduates receiving diplomas and 2-year and 4-year degrees in May; the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) granted Briarcliffe College Division II Exploratory Status; Briarcliffe College celebrated its 41<sup>st</sup> anniversary on Long Island; Briarcliffe College announced its partnerships with Epoch 5, a Long Island-based public relations firm, and The EGC Group, Inc., a Long Island-based marketing firm, and launched its branding Go Far campaign; Briarcliffe College's third location in Long Island City, Queens, was granted 'Center' status by the New York State Education Department (NYSED); Briarcliffe College introduced two new specializations within the BBA in management degree program specifically Entrepreneurship and International Business, 35 totally on-line courses, and AAS degree programs in both Computer Information Systems and Networking & Computer Technology; the Bethpage campus underwent major infrastructure renovations; Rudy Giuliani, former Mayor of New York City, and candidate for President of the United States visited the Patchogue campus; Briarcliffe College rolled out a major initiative to attract and retain the Hispanic-serving community of Long Island; the Women's Basketball Team is ranked #18 in the USCAA; attrition rates fell to an all-time low at Briarcliffe College, eclipsing prior year's rate by 10%; and Briarcliffe College was named Best Professional School by the "Long Island Business News".*

## Queens Site Receives Center Status by NYSED

Since 2005, Briarcliffe College has operated a site in Long Island City that has offered 75% of the Associate Degree program in Criminal Justice. As a site, the college was limited to offering only 350 registrations AND 15 courses per year. In mid-Novem-

ber, the college received notice from the New York Department of Education (NYSED) that the Queens site was upgraded to center status, thus giving Briarcliffe College permission to expand the number of student registrations, enrollments, and degree offerings. Plans to offer new degree programs in the near future are in the works, including the AAS degree program in business administration and the BBA in management.

Presently she hosts one of the longest running poetry venues in the NYC area, The Green Pavilion Poetry Event a monthly reading in Brooklyn.

## **Entrepreneurship Specialization Introduced**

In January 2008, Briarcliffe College will begin offering specialized courses in entrepreneurship as part of the BBA in Management Degree Program. The first course in the

concentration, Introduction to Entrepreneurial Management, is available to day and evenings students, on both the Bethpage and Patchogue campuses during the Spring 2008 semester. More than 60 Briarcliffe College students have registered to take this first course in the entrepreneurship concentration during the Spring 2008 semester. Briarcliffe College's entrepreneurship concentration is designed for students who may be interested in owning and operating their own business, who wish to work in a business with less than 100 employees or may want to work for a larger organization in a business development role. Students who complete the concentration will be able to function effectively in either a start-up or entrepreneurial situation and they can learn to analyze and direct business organizations from a managerial perspective.

Briarcliffe College's entrepreneurship concentration is unique in that it is dedicated to producing citizens who are vocationally autonomous while being socially responsive to the needs of the community and society. Courses such as Social Entrepreneurship, Entrepreneurship for Women and Minorities and Entrepreneurs with Disabilities are designed to teach students about how to do well not only for the organizations that will work for, but also for society.

## **Hispanic Scholarship Announced**

In September, Briarcliffe College further demonstrated its support and commitment of the Hispanic community by announcing it will award two grants in Spring 2008 under a newly created Hispanic Scholarship

program. A committee will review applications filed by March 28, 2008 with one grant of \$10,000 and another of \$5,000 to be awarded. "Briarcliffe College recognizes that financial pressures negatively impact high school graduation and college completion, and the purpose of these scholarships is to help student with dreams of higher education to stay in school and attain their goals," said Briarcliffe College President Dr. George Santiago, Jr.

Those meeting the following criteria may apply for the 2008 Hispanic Scholarship:

- A first-time, full-time matriculated student enrolled in a four-year degree program at Briarcliffe College;
- A student of Hispanic origin;
- A resident of Long Island or the Greater New York metropolitan area;
- A high school diploma upon entrance to Briarcliffe College;
- A high school senior with a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher as of the end of the junior year;
- Enrolled and matriculated at Briarcliffe College in July 2008 and then be continuously enrolled full-time through the scholarship award period;
- Submit a 750 word essay on "The Impact of Higher Education on the Hispanic Community;"
- Submit two (2) letters of recommendation (teacher and community service);
- Complete the scholarship application and the Briarcliffe College admissions application.

To be considered for a 2008 Hispanic Scholarship, a completed application, essay, and two letters of recommendation must be returned to the Briarcliffe College Financial Aid Office (1055 Stewart Avenue, Bethpage,

NY 11714) by the submission deadline, March 28, 2008. Awardees will be notified of the committee's decision in April. ## College Named One of the Best Art Colleges

"For five years, *Long Island Press* has been the newspaper that entertains, educates, and informs the opinion leaders of Long Island," according to publisher Ned Morey. In its recent annual "2008 Best of Long Island" issue, Briarcliffe College was voted one of the best arts colleges on Long Island.

The nomination process began in June. The voting began on October 29<sup>th</sup> and ended on December 22, with more than 120,000 votes cast. "The recognition of Briarcliffe College as one of the best art colleges on Long Island is well-deserved in my opinion. Our faculty offer outstanding learning opportunities for students wishing to pursue a career in the arts. I am very proud of them," says Dr. Kenneth Thigpen, Briarcliffe College Provost.

## Disaster Recovery Plans Unveiled

Following the disastrous and unfortunate tragedy at Virginia Tech University in March 2007, Briarcliffe College set out on a strategic course to

evaluate its disaster recovery plans, policies and procedures, training, relationships with key emergency response officials, and communications to name a few. A Security Task Force was established, led by Victor Petrigliano, Professor of Criminal Justice, to review all aspects of security. Its report will be released in early spring 2008.

In the meantime, in late November 2007, Dr. Santiago set the stage for an important discussion about campus safety and the disaster recovery plans before the entire campus community. He strongly encouraged the faculty and staff to think about the plans that were being presented and to share their ideas and thoughts during the question and answer portion of the presentation.

Susan Pescador, Director of Compliance, went on to give a presentation titled "Campus Safety and Disaster Recovery Plans." The presentation highlighted a brief history of campus safety and an overview of the Emergency Response-Disaster Recovery Plans that are in place for the Bethpage Campus, Patchogue Campus and the Queens Center. Important aspects of the plans include campus lockdown, fire, bomb and weather related closing procedures.

The next steps include implementation of a more effective communications system; enhanced training for faculty, staff, and students; revised policies and procedures; relationship building with local emergency response personnel; and emergency response simulations.

# Sports Shorts

## Men's & Women's Bowling:

The men's and women's bowling teams are off to a great start this year. So far they have competed in three tournaments and the men have won scholarship money in two tournaments. They finished first in the Blue Hen Open and sixth at the Penn State Classic. The women's team placed fourth in two of the three tournaments. The veterans and rookies are working well together and helping both teams succeed. The teams are looking forward to a competitive and successful season. Up next are the annual Roto Grip Keystone Quaker Classic in Pennsylvania and the Nit-tany Lion Kegler Classic in New Jersey.

## Ice Hockey:

Even though our 2-6 record isn't an indication of our play, we have had quite a few bright spots so far this season. On a positive note, both James Sweeney (Connetquot HS in Bohemia) and Alan Bernie (Bellport HS) have been named All-Stars and will represent Briarcliffe College in Albany on January 5 at 2:30 p.m. Freshman Ryan Maresco (Ward Melville HS in East Setauket) is another bright spot on this year's squad. "Although Ryan did not play competitive hockey in high school, he has worked very hard both on and off the ice," says Head Coach Mike Zguris. Goaltender Chris Orlando (Longwood HS in Middle Island) is having a comeback season. After spending all of last year rehabbing a groin injury and didn't play, this year Chris is our comeback player at this point in the season. A key injury to our leading scorer, Ryan Huhás (St. Anthony's HS in Huntington), has sidelined

him for the past 8 weeks. The team returns to the ice for the second half of the season on January 12<sup>th</sup> hosting Farmingdale State University.

## Women's Basketball:

The Lady Seahawks are currently ranked in the top 20 in the nation for women's basketball as of the end of the first-half of the season. The 18<sup>th</sup> ranked team in the USCAA comes into 2008 primed to enter the top ten with key match ups against conference rivals New Hampshire Tech, Southern Maine and St. Joe's of Brooklyn. These key games could put Briarcliffe College women's hoops in a place they have never been before – Top Ten in America USCAA.

Former Seaford H.S. varsity coach and Director of the Long Island Lightning Girls AAU program, Jay Lynch, took over the reigns as Briarcliffe College's head women's basketball coach in the spring 2007. First and foremost was recruiting young ladies for Briarcliffe with NCAA Division II status on the horizon. "The freshman class at BC is second to none here on Long Island and in the metro area," says Coach Lynch. Six highly touted young ladies signed to continue their higher educational goals here at BC including Nina Creese (NYC's leading scorer averaging 32 points per game in her senior year at Wingate HS); Elisha Raiford (NYC leading rebounder averaging 22 rebounds in her senior year at Bryant HS); Leona Virgo (NYC's second leading scorer in her junior year at Jane Adams HS, with only Rutgers point guard Epiphany Prince scoring more points per game; as a senior, Ms. Virgo was #8 in scoring and #12 in assists in NYC); Tabrese Harris (out of East New York where she averaged 19 plus points per game in her senior year); Helena

Sargeant (out of national powerhouse Murry Bergtraum HS in NYC); and Amarylys Ortiz (out of Newtown HS where she was #20 in assists in NYC's PSAL).

Returning players include Jenese Bennett (senior captain from Riverhead HS and named to the all-tournament team at the Hesser Holiday Festival); Keda Robertson (junior from Virginia); Tara Wallace (freshman walk-on from Uniondale HS); Laura McTaggart (from Rocklin HS in California); and Michelle Bauerschmidt (walk-on from Levittown Division HS).

## Men's Basketball

Entering the 2007-08 season, head coach Bertram Arthur anticipated a slow start due to the inexperience of the young men's basketball team. Finishing the first half of the season 3-5, with losses only to NCAA Division II colleges, Coach Arthur is confident the student-athletes will turn it around and become more consistent during the second half.

On November 20<sup>th</sup>, Nikita Davis (HS of Telecommunication, Arts & Technology in Brooklyn), a 6'6" freshman, set a Briarcliffe men's basketball scoring record with 37 points against a tough New Jersey City University team. Nikita currently leads the team in points and rebounds and is also one of the top players in the USCAA Division I men's program.

The men's basketball team has produced wins over a solid Lehman College (Bronx), Berkley College (Manhattan) and a hard fought overtime victory over Montclair State University (NJ). The win over Montclair State has created a buzz around the local area for the young program. Dan Napolitano (Farmingdale HS) finished with a game high 22 points.
